

This partnership has sparked innovation and collaboration within AON and Centennial Place. We would like to welcome our two Trent University Nursing Students for the fall term Marvel and Emily – who will be assisting with the gap analysis and roll out of our newest Best Practice Guideline – Transitions in Care and Services under the guidance of our Clinical Support Nurse – Molly Westland. We continue to strive for improving quality of life and care of the residents here at Centennial Place.

As mentioned in the June newsletter, Jordyn Woodhouse was accepted into the Wound Care Champion Program for Regulated Health-Care Providers. Promoting Quality of Life at AON

A palliative approach to care can begin as soon as a resident moves into AON Long-term Care (LTC). A main focus within palliative care is the promotion of quality of life for residents. It is helpful for LTC care teams to be knowledgeable about what is important to a resident in order to promote their quality of life.

Questions to ask when considering how best to promote quality of life

1. What are your most important goals and wishes currently?

No wish or goal is too small to report to the care team. When thinking this question through, consider all the little things that you enjoy and that help contribute to a sense of wellbeing.

2. Is religion or spirituality important to you? Are there any religious or spiritual practices that should be included in your care?

Proper palliative care considers an individual's culture, spirituality and religion into the provision of their care. Share with the care team as much as you can about the aspects of your religion or spirituality that are important to you.

3. What brings you comfort or joy?

Sometimes these can be small, often overlooked details – a morning coffee made just the way you like it, having the blinds opened to let the sun into your room, getting a breath of fresh air in the afternoon.

Considering these 3 questions is an excellent start in considering how LTC care teams can help enhance and maintain quality of life, however this is only just a drop in the bucket when understanding what matters most to a person living with a chronic illness.
