Spring has taken its time to get here but we have had a few nice days and are looking forward to more.

Our beautiful pond fountain has been installed as well.

We have begun some of our outside work and will be continuing work with the garden areas by adding mulch and edging the flowerbeds. All of our grounds are maintained with an underground irrigation system to keep the gardens and grass well watered. The system is divided into multiple zones that water different sections of the property during the early morning hours – usually between 1am and 7am. When we activate the system, please let us know if there is a sprinkler head that is not working or spraying in the wrong direction. Also if there is a spot that seem too wet or too dry then we can adjust the system times to address this issue. With the underground sprinkler systems, we ask that residents not add any plants to the garden areas.

Outside window cleaning will also be completed shortly.

A gentle reminder that family/substitute decision makers are responsible for appointments with health care professionals outside of the building. Once an appointment is made please let us know the following:

- When the appointment is
 - What time the resident will be picked up
 - What information is required for the appointment (for example nursing notes, medication administration record, physician notes)
 - What time is the expected return
 - If the resident will be missing a meal, eating while they are out, or if a meal should be saved for them
- Families/substitute decision makers are responsible for:
- Attending the appointment with the resident or arranging an alternative person to attend.
 - Transportation – if transportation needs to be booked or arranged
 - Scheduling the appointment
 - Rescheduling the appointment if it needs to be moved
 - Notifying the Charge Nurse when the appointment is and the results of the appointment (did they recommend any medication changes etcetera).

If you need assistance navigating or sourcing external services our Social Service Worker: Alex Rawek, may be of some assistance – however she is not available to book services for you.

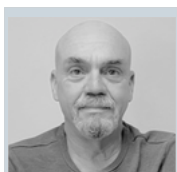

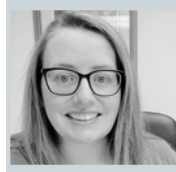

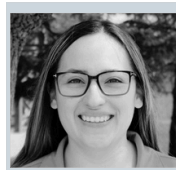
